## Eye Clinic Now Ready!

The Eye Clinic Building is now complete, staff have moved in and the final tidying of the grounds is in progress. Dr. Mohammed, the Ophthalmic Surgeon, began his training at Hyderabad in India on 1<sup>st</sup> April. The Ophthalmic Nurse, Hirut Dinqa, together with Tekle Benti Simesse the Clinic Manager and Head Nurse are now also in India receiving their training.

Existing equipment has been transferred from the hospital to the new clinic but no work will be undertaken until staff return from India. Alex Taylor and Qes Alemu Nega have worked hard on the ordering of equipment but this is a slow process as it also involves getting clearance through Ethiopian Customs.

A request for curtains was answered by Rev Martyn Skinner and his congregations up in Trowbridge, Wiltshire. They made up 20 pairs of curtains which, I understand, are already on their way to Ethiopia. They have also raised over £2,500 towards the Eye Clinic Project and Martyn will provide us with a report in the next newsletter.

## Land End's to John O'Groats

Phil Holland (71) & Les Jones (70) have successfully completed their cycle ride from Land's End to John O'Groats, a total of 953 miles in 17 days. Phil writes:

"We left Lands End on 5 May and arrived at John O'Groats on 21 May. My friend Les was supporting Macmillan Cancer Care and Bristol Alzheimer Research and I sought sponsors for the Exeter-Ethiopia Link.

Including the riding before and after the main trip, we cycled a total distance of 1007 miles. We had our good days (leisurely lunches in the sun in Devon) and our bad days (pushing bikes up a 1 in 4 hill into a headwind in the cloud as we entered County Durham).

We know for certain that we have raised more than £1,600, and it seems that there is still over £200 to come. So the Link should get something in the region of £900 - not a bad result considering that we didn't plan on sponsorship."
